Please note the following information about the work being done at the Route 9A Boat Launch Parking Lot area this month

Boat Ramp Parking Lot On Route 9A. Improvements to watershed drainage will begin at the boat ramp parking lot on Monday, April 22. Usage of the parking lot will be limited to allow for storage of materials and equipment for the work from April 22 for a week, possibly longer depending on weather conditions. Anyone expecting to park a vehicle/boat trailer at the lot during that period is encouraged to use the Ware's Grove parking lot while the drainage work is underway. Please obey signs at the parking lot and at the boat ramp regarding usage during the construction. The start date and period for the work is dependent on weather conditions.

### 💰 😭 Vernal Pools 🐌 🌻

A week ago, the sound of peepers was in the air due to the warm temperatures we were enjoying. Now that we are plunged [blown!] back into Winter the nights are quiet again. But soon enough, the annual migration of a variety of amphibians and reptiles will make their journey to a woodland vernal pool not far from their home to breed. When the temperature and rainfall provide the right balance, almost the entire local population of these critters will make their way to a specified vernal pool on a single night. The vernal pools are essential to the next generation of these species. The pools are absent a continuous flow of water, relying instead on rainfall. Hence, Springtime and its showers are peak time for their activity. Because the pools go through cycles of dryness and have low oxygen levels, fish cannot survive giving the visitors a greater chance for survival. The food source is from the leaves that gather in the pools, which in the process of decaying, attract numerous insects for the frogs, salamanders and turtles to feast upon. Some of those creatures will be food themselves for other forest dwellers such as snakes, raccoons and owls who seek out the pools. It is fascinating to think that one reasonably sized vernal pool can attract several thousand wood frogs! It is also something of a surprise that these creatures who depend on vernal pools make up a large portion of the wildlife in the forest, many of them living 20 years and within a few hundred feet of a particular pool. ## Office of Emergency Management/OEM: April 2024 Monthly Report

A Solar Eclipse is passing Chesterfield on Monday, April 8, 2024 at about 3:30pm

A total solar eclipse will darken the daytime skies of Northern New Hampshire. The partial eclipse should begin sometime after 3pm here. An hour later, the full eclipse will set in and last for about three minutes. Here are some thoughts from Dartmouth Hitchcock Medical Center:

Never stare directly at the sun!

A solar eclipse occurs when the moon blocks any part of the sun from view. The "totality" phase—or the full solar eclipse—means the moon is entirely blocking the sun. This year, the full solar eclipse can be observed from areas of Northern Vermont and Northern New Hampshire, as well as from other select

locations in the United States. To find the exact path of the eclipse, you can go to Xavier Jubier's Google Map. Note that times displayed in the map are in UT time.

#### What is safe?

Eclipse glasses or a solar filter must be used when viewing the eclipse. Zegans recommends following an expert protocol for viewing, such as the one posted on the American Academy of Ophthalmology website. Their recommendations include:

# Carefully look at your solar filter or eclipse glasses before using them. If you see any scratches or damage, do not use them.

Always read and follow all directions that come with the solar filter or eclipse glasses. Help children to be
sure they use handheld solar viewers and eclipse glasses correctly.

 Before looking up at the bright sun, stand still and cover your eyes with your eclipse glasses or solar viewer. After glancing at the sun, turn away and remove your glasses or viewer—do not remove them while looking at the sun.
