

Tax bills for the first bill of 2023 were sent out on May 11, 2023. If you have not received your bill in the mail by June 1, 2023, please contact the Tax Collector's office at 603-363-4624 ex.14 and we will send you another copy. This bill is due on July 5, 2023. In person payments can be made on Monday between 2:00 p m and 6:00 pm. We will also be open for in-person payments on Wednesday, July 5, 2023 from 2-6PM. Also as a reminder, if you have an escrow account with your mortgage please do not send in a direct payment. We will not be making any refunds for overpayments until the middle of July so you could tie up your funds for a long period of time. We also offer electronic payments through the town's website under the Tax Collector department. Credit Card and Debit Card payments can only be made on line. Cards cannot be accepted as an in-person payment in the office.

Artist Rebekah Bassen Presentation, Wednesday July 13, 6:00 PM Rebekah Bassen is an artist and designer who works with hand woven textiles and sculptures as well as on paper developed using the techniques and processes of traditional surface design.

As a student of sociology and photography at Simmons college in Boston, she developed an observational practice that has translated to her works in fiber. Her work is formulated in response to sensory and psychological experiences as well as the properties of her physical materials. The resulting works are meditations on daily environments; the contrasts, compositions and shifting of the world around us.

In 2017, Rebekah received a BFA in Textile and Surface design from The Fashion Institute of Technology. She has applied the skills honed there in a variety of ways including textile education for youth, as a staff designer at a mill, designer of hospitality upholstery and as an art fabricator developing techniques for fine artists looking to incorporate fiber and textile techniques into their work.

Rebekah currently consults with artists and designers under her company R. Bassen Studio while continuing her own art practice with a current interest in large scale woven "paintings" and exploration of basketry technique.

Chesterfield Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Report – July 2023

Chesterfield OEM is working diligently to support our community! As our local government prepares for everyday emergencies, the number and scope of incidents can overwhelm conventional emergency services. OEM volunteers are trained to assist. This valuable course is designed as a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens may initially be alone and their actions can make a difference. We work closely with the NH Homeland Security & Emergency Management (HSEM) teams and had our LEOP (Local Emergency Operations Plan) approved and renewed for the next few years.

Updates to date from the Chesterfield OEM team:

- 1 OEM offered N95 Masks via the OEM committee members to spread the word to residents when the Canadian Fire Smoke Conditions impacted our area in early June. If we had a more comprehensive mailing, we would have offered them directly to township resident. We are working on compiling a single list and encourage you to SIGN up when it is offered.
- 2 OEM hosted an EOC (Emergency Operations Center) in March when the community lost power and we had a generator running in the OEM facility to provide power for phones, PCs, etc. We also provided snacks and were staffed by OEM volunteers in 2-hour shifts.
- 3 There was a Chesterfield School Fire Educational Burn held on April 14 as a means to do training in the event of a field/area fire. Many Cheshire County organizations participated and it was also a big success. Our thanks to the many public and private entities participating.

4 – In FY'2022, our OEM team and Town Administrator, Alissa Thompson, worked together to use NH State Funding to purchase a number of resources. This was a 9:1 split for up to \$50,000 in risk-based supplies and services. Together with the OEM Budget, police and fire participation, we invested about \$5,000 and the State of NH matched us with about \$45,000 in funds.

- 5 Within this 9:1 Grant program, Chesterfield gained the following important safety items;
 - a. New generator
 - b. New electrical road sign
 - c. New AEDs for police use
 - d. New telephone system in the OEM office
 - e. Additional PPE's, masks, supplies, kits for COVID support
 - f. MREs (Meals Ready to Eat) and other necessary supplies.
- 6 On Saturday, June 3, Ralph Petti and John Keppler (Deputy OEM Director), attended an all-day Emergency Preparedness event in the Concord region to learn of new resources available by HSEM and other agencies and to network with neighboring town. Thanks for going, John!!
