

CHESTERFIELD POLICE DEPARTMENT

On May 31st, 2023 Lt. Michael Bomba officially retired from the Chesterfield Police Department. Michael always gave the Town of Chesterfield 110%. It did not matter what he was doing, if someone needed him, he was there. We could always count him. Michael did not seek recognition. There were many occasions when I heard from residents and strangers that wanted to tell me what a great job he did. On more than one occasion, Michael has given money for gas or food to strangers who needed help.

Michael enjoyed working with the students of Chesterfield School and was a staple in being a chaperone in Natures Classroom. When Michael walks into the school, I frequently heard "BOMBA" shouted from students. The shouts were quickly followed up with "high five's." Michael is going to be missed.

The following is a message which was read from Cheshire County Dispatch:

"Lt. Bomba, congratulations on your retirement after 25 years of your dedication to Law Enforcement.

You started your career with the Hinsdale Police in 1998 and then attended the 119th New Hampshire Police full time academy in 1999. During your tenure at the Hinsdale Police Department, you held the rank of Patrolman, Senior Patrolman, Field Training Officer and Corporal.

You left the Hinsdale Police Department to work for the Chesterfield Police Department. While at the Chesterfield Police Department, you started as a patrolman then rose to the ranks Lieutenant in 2018. While there you were a Taser Instructor, Firearms Instructor, Shotgun Instructor and Rifle Instructor.

Lieutenant Michael Bomba, you are 10-2 for the final time. On behalf of all of your brothers and sisters in Law Enforcement, we thank you for your commitment and dedication and wish you the very best in your future endeavors."

Chesterfield Office of Emergency Management (OEM) Report - June 2023

Chesterfield OEM is working diligently to support our community! As our local government prepares for everyday emergencies, the number and scope of incidents can overwhelm conventional emergency services. OEM volunteers are trained to assist. This valuable course is designed as a positive and realistic approach to emergency and disaster situations where citizens may initially be alone and their actions can make a difference. We work closely with the NH Homeland Security & Emergency Management (HSEM) teams and had our LEOP (Local Emergency Operations Plan) approved and renewed for the next few years.

Updates to date from the Chesterfield OEM team:

- 1 HSEM Drill discussion was held for the school on March 23 and we are still awaiting a next step to proceed positively, but gently focusing on Safety for all students, faculty, parents, etc. There were many potential risk scenarios discussed attended by our fire/police/OEM teams.
- 2 OEM hosted an EOC (Emergency Operations Center) when the community lost power and we had a generator running in the OEM facility to provide power for phones, PCs, etc. We also provided snacks and were staffed by OEM volunteers in 2-hour shifts from 8am-4pm.
- 3 There was a Chesterfield School Fire Educational Burn held on April 14 as a means to do training in the event of a field/area fire. Many Cheshire County organizations participated and it was also a big success. Our thanks to the many public and private entities participating.
- 4 In FY'2022, our OEM team and Town Administrator, Alissa Thompson, worked together to use NH State Funding to purchase a number of resources. This was a 9:1 split for up to \$50,000 in risk-based supplies and services. Together with the OEM Budget, police and fire participation, we invested about \$5,000 and the State of NH matched us with about \$45,000 in funds.
 - 5 Within this 9:1 Grant program, Chesterfield gained the following important safety items;
 - a. New generator
 - b. New electrical road sign
 - c. New AEDs for police use
 - d. New telephone system in the OEM office
 - e. Additional PPE's, masks, supplies, kits for COVID support
 - f. MREs (Meals Ready to Eat) and other necessary supplies.
- 6 On May 6th, members of our OEM team took inventory and helped to re-organize our supply area with many new supplies to replace/enhance currently in inventory at the OEM office in the basement area. THANKS FOR THE GREAT TEAMWORK!
