Board of Selectmen Notes October 2023

There will be limited access to the boat launch and the boat launch parking lot after Columbus Day Weekend. All Spofford Lake boat owners, take note. Drainage work to protect lake water quality is scheduled to begin at the boat launch and launch parking off Route 9A after October 10 (exact dates for work are weather dependent). Partial closure of the ramp and parking lot during construction is necessary for the safety of the public and the construction crews. Please watch for signage in the area while this work is being done.

Draw down of the lake level also will begin right after the Columbus Day weekend.

This notice is being provided early to help you plan as you consider taking your boat out of the lake this fall.

The Transfer Station is temporarily **not** accepting credit card payments. Please plan accordingly and bring a check since we also do not accept cash payments. Thanks for your understanding.


The Recycle Center is open from 7:30 AM to 4:30 PM, please arrive no later than 4:15PM to dispose of your rubbish.
